Rationale and Aims
<p>Mission in the West in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century will involve, to a significant extent, the work of many non-Western missionaries and Christians living and serving in the West. This module explores the contextual issues that these non-Western missionaries need to negotiate to be effective in their work.</p> <p>Aims:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To explore and critically engage with contemporary and appropriate expressions, models and examples of discipleship, leadership, community-formation and church-planting within a cross-cultural ministry setting</li> <li>2. To explore and evaluate the barriers faced by non-Western Christian missionary work in the Western context</li> <li>3. To evaluate and critique skills, practices, and competencies for effective cross-cultural mission and community-formation in Western contexts</li> </ol>
