Rationale and Aims
<p>The concept of community is central to Trinitarian theology, as well as to the notion of missio Dei. This module explores what is distinctive about faith communities nurtured by the Christian narrative, and how such communities can be formed in practice. Leadership of such communities needs to cultivate imagination for mission alongside creating effective structures for discipleship. Specific skills include resolving conflict and the development of small group contexts for effective discipleship.</p> <p>Aims:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To critically evaluate definitions of community and formulate appropriate Christian definitions of the concept of community 2. To critically explore the place of small groups in a missional ecclesiology 3. To critically evaluate approaches to interpersonal transactions that contribute to community formation, including the practices of mentoring and conflict management
